

## **CHAPTER V**

### **CONCLUSION**

#### **A. Conclusion**

Based on the analysis of the results of research that has been carried out, conclusions can be drawn which are the answers to the following problems:

1. The legal protection that the Regional Police Banyumas have provided for children as victims of sexual exploitation is in the form of report services and consulting services, medical assistance, and cooperation with the Regional Technical Implementation Unit for the Protection of Women and Children in Banyumas and Social Service provide assistance and counseling with psychologists for psychological recovery, rehabilitation, and social reintegration. The Regional Police Banyumas has also conducted socialization related to sexual exploitation. However, there is legal protection as a victim's right that the Regional Police Banyumas has not provided, namely in the form of restitution services, translators assistance services for children with disabilities, and temporary living expenses assistance.
2. The obstacle factors of the Regional Police Banyumas in providing legal protection for children as victims of sexual exploitation are seen from the components of the legal structure, including lack of human resources, the implementation of shelters has not been maximized, there is no budget for psychological recovery of victims, and has not implemented cooperation with the Banyumas Regency Education Office. Furthermore, the legal

substance is that Banyumas Regency does not yet have a regional regulation on child friendly Regency/City. Related to the legal culture is the negative view of the community. The other obstacle factor is from the aspect of the victim themselves, where the victim does not feel like a victim and enjoys the benefits of sexual exploitation, so some of them become perpetrators of sexual exploitation.

## **B. Recommendations**

1. The author hopes that legal protection for children as victims of sexual exploitation can run optimally. It is necessary to assist in restitution by the Regional Police Banyumas. Including the need for additional human resources and expanding cooperation with psychologists, psychiatrists, the Banyumas Regency Banyumas Regency Banyumas Regency Education Office, and translators for people with disabilities. The Regional Police Banyumas also needs to increase the budget for the psychological recovery of victims and temporary living expenses for victims. Facilities and infrastructure also need to be improved, especially concerning shelters.
2. The Banyumas Regency Government needs to have a regional regulation on child friendly Regency/City. Including the improvement of the Banyumas Regency Regional Regulation Number 1 of 2021 concerning the Implementation of Child Protection related to the regulation of preventive legal protection and the regulation of the period of procedure for legal protection services by law enforcement officers.
