CHAPTER V

Conclusion and Suggestion

5.1 Conclusion

Based on analysis of the Linguistic Category Models (LCM) by Fiedler, Semin, and Coenen (2006) and Factor Initiating Stereotype by Atjony (2011) on interview with Oprah Winfrey and Meghan Markle there are some conclusion

- 1. According to data, the researcher found 22 data Linguistic Category Models.

 There are Descriptive Action Verbs (DAVs), Interpretive Action Verbs (IAVs),

 State Verbs (SVs), Adjectives (ADJs), and Noun Categories (NCs). Noun

 Category is the most prominent feature that emerges because stereotyped speech directed at someone is closely related to that person's personality or appearance. Meanwhile, the frequency of using descriptive action verbs (DAV) is the lowest in the out-group.
- 2. Based on data, the researcher found 14 data Factors Initiating stereotype, as a Way of Simplifying the Demand of the Perceiver (ASDP), Different Social Roles (DSR), Group Conflict (GC), Different Power (DP), and the last is Response to a Need of Social Identity (RNSI). From the data the researcher concludes the most dominant Factors Initiating Stereotype is Group Conflict, a conflict over Meghan Markle's children skin color who are deemed less worthy of royal titles. As a Way of Simplifying the Demand of the Perceiver (ASDP) and Different Social Roles (DSR) become the least

Based on the analysis of Linguistic Category Models and Factor Initiating Stereotype of Meghan Markle and Oprah Winfrey interview, there are some suggestions:

- 1. English Literature students who read this thesis are expected to understand the use of language in a multicultural society due to the phenomenon of stereotyping in a multicultural society related to racist stereotypes. It is useful so that they can know the forms of racist stereotypes that exist and can learn about Linguistic Category Models.
