## 5.1 Conclusion

NF's music video and lyrics for "Let You Down" depict the inner conflict between the ID, Ego, and Superego, offering insight into his emotional distress. The ID surfaces through his raw expressions of anger and frustration, driven by the desire to escape from his problem and disappointment he feels toward his father. The Ego navigates this emotion, trying to mediate his need for connection, as seen in the scenes where he tries to break free. The Superego is seen in the deep sense of guilt and regret, particularly through the father's remorse in the funeral scene. Together, these evident shows the psychological frameworks which NF face, torn between unfulfilled desires, self-reflection, and internalized expectations of himself and others.

The trust issues NF went through are closely tied to the circumstances of his upbringing, particularly his complicated relationship with his father. The lack of emotional support, constant criticism, and feelings of being let down by his parents

during his childhood created a foundation of trust issues. As a child, he likely internalized the message of those closest to him. NF parental figures were unreliable or even abusive behavior towards him leads to him building walls and question others' sincerity in adulthood. His lyrics and visual of the song portray his fear of vulnerability and betrayal, reflecting how these experiences shaped his view. This unresolved emotional pain from childhood manifests in his art as an ongoing struggle to trust, connect, and feel secure in relationships, leaving a lasting impact on his sense of self and his ability to rely on others.
