

V. CONCLUSION AND IMPLICATION

A. Conclusion

From the analysis that has been carried out, economic sectors that are potential sectors in BARLINGMASCAKEB Regency have been identified, namely 1) Business Activities, 2) Mining and Quarrying, 3) Mining and Quarrying, 4) Processing Industry, 5) Financial Services and Insurance Activities. Potential sector does not mean a perfect sector (absolute) in the sense that it has a positive value. In other words, the profit of a sector is relative. In order for the basic sector in the BARLINGMASCAKEB area to be more focused, further research is needed to spatially map the location of the identified leading sectors, by referring to the spatial plan of the BARLINGMASCAKEB area so that a formulation of the BARLINGMASCAKEB regional development strategy can be produced based on the regional potential sector.

A. Implication

From the results of the research analysis and the conclusions that have been described, there are implications, which are as follows:

1. Potential sectors must be further nurtured and developed without neglecting development to other sectors.
2. Build or upgrade a supporting physical infrastructure development of each sector.

With coordination in the BARLINGMASCAKEB district area as a growth center, in order to build good cooperation to improve the economy, based on the potential of each region, so as to minimize the level of inequality and increase economic growth.

B. Limitation of Research

The limitation of this study is that the author only researched 5 districts in Central Java, namely Purbalingga Regency, Banjarnegara Regency, Banyumas Regency, Kebumen Regency, and Cilacap Regency. In addition, the researcher only used the Growth Ratio Model (GRM), Location Quotient Analysis (LQ), and Overlay Analysis analysis tools. The conclusions drawn are only based on the results of data analysis, so it is hoped that with further research on potential sectors in different regions and with different analysis methods, wider and larger samples, and the use of different and more complete research instruments.

And the researcher only used secondary data sourced from the Central Statistics Agency of each of Purbalingga Regency, Banjarnegara Regency, Banyumas Regency, Kebumen Regency, and Cilacap Regency in the period of 2015-2021 and due to the ongoing Covid-19 Pandemic conditions at the time the research was carried out.
