

CHAPTER V

CLOSING

A. Conclusion

Based on the results of the research that has been conducted and the discussion of the research results, it can be concluded that:

1. Legal protection for victims of online gender-based violence (KBGO) in Banyumas Regency has been implemented well, as evidenced by the fulfillment of preventive aspects in the form of prevention carried out at the beginning of case handling by providing an understanding of the rights of victims, such as the right to protection and data confidentiality, the right to receive reports without discrimination, as well as the right to clear information regarding the complaint process and case handling in accordance with Law Number 12 of 2022 concerning Sexual Violence Crimes in Article 67 paragraph (1). This aims to prevent violations of victims' rights and ensure that the entire assistance process is carried out safely, openly, and in the interests and safety of the victims. In addition, the Banyumas Regency PPA UPTD has also fulfilled the repressive aspect by handling victims after a case of sexual violence has occurred, by providing psychological, legal, and medical assistance, including referrals to Margono Regional General Hospital.
2. The handling of online gender-based violence (KBGO) by the Banyumas District PPA Technical Implementation Unit (UPTD) has been carried

out well but is not yet optimal. The process of managing GBV cases has been carried out well in accordance with Standard Operating Procedures (SOP), starting from receiving reports from victims, either directly by visiting the UPTD PPA office or indirectly through SAPA 129. After the report is received, officers will conduct an initial assessment to determine the condition of the victim. Based on the assessment results, victims receive services tailored to their needs, such as psychological counseling and legal assistance. However, there are obstacles in the case handling process, such as limited human resources. With only 7 staff and 4 active assistants to handle cases in 27 sub-districts, the effectiveness of KBGO handling is hampered. Another obstacle is the victims' families, who feel that KBGO cases are a disgrace and choose to cover up the cases by not wanting the handling process to continue in order to maintain their good name or reputation.

B. Suggestion

1. In order to ensure that KBGO management runs smoothly and optimally, the Banyumas Regency PPA Technical Implementation Unit (UPTD) is expected to increase its human resources.
2. In order to realize legal protection for victims in Banyumas Regency, it is hoped that victims and their families will not be influenced by a culture that often blames victims for the events they have experienced without objectively considering the psychological impact caused,

because this attitude can hinder the victim's mental recovery process and reduce the effectiveness of the protection and assistance that victims should receive.
